Biography: David Archibald - songwriter/storyteller

Sure, he's worked with music industry icons like **Avril Lavigne** and **Howard Shore**, but David Archibald is most at home in a park setting on a midsummer's night. His engaging and interactive performances have become camper favourites across the country. His work on Great Lakes marine heritage **Spirit of the Inland Sea** led to a full-length musical at the **Blyth Festival** (**The Perilous Pirate's Daughter**) and an invitation to give a workshop on the traditional music of the Great Lakes at the **North American Folk Alliance** Convention in Cleveland, Ohio.

Several National and Provincial Parks have commissioned David to write and record songs based on their natural and cultural history. These include: *Pukaskwa: Songs of Superior* (Pukaskwa National Park); *Spirit of the Inland Sea* (Bruce Peninsula National Park); *Savanna, Sand & Butterflies* (Pinery Provincial Park); *St. Nora's Tower* (Frost Centre); and *Legends and Lore of the Charleston Shore* (Charleston Lake Provincial Park). "Blue Mountain Blue" from the Charleston Lake project is featured on the popular CD *Canoesongs Vol. 2.*

Much of David's work has been in the field of children's music. He has written for and performed on **Sesame Street** in New York and CBC's **Mr. Dressup**. His pop-music compositions have been recorded with **RCA**. David's music has been regularly featured on **CBC Radio**.

Whether it is in poignant or comic mode, Archibald blends first-rate entertainment with gentle education covering everything from Ecological Integrity to Isostatic Rebound, from Species at Risk to Sleeping Giants.
